Pastor's Parable

Although most of us aren't aware of it, we have a future that's already been written. Our future is written by hopes, fears, dreams, expectations, and decisions made about life. In the same way, organizations have futures written by history, circumstances, culture, aspirations, successes, and failures. These already-writtenfutures determine and shape our belief, actions and attitudes thatform the basis of what is possible for our future. I am working with a group of colleagues on a book about organizational change. Although it was written over nine years ago, it's relevance for St. Andrew's is outstanding. Entitled The Three Laws of Performance, Steve Zaffron and Dave Logan detail a wonderful reminder that things we don't see determine what we do see, and therefore, what really is possible that has yet to be named and discovered. The Three Laws of Performance explains that "Change doesn't happen in a vacuum; it happens when people see and hear a future they can get excited about. What is the future of St. Andrew's? How do we envision that future? Will it be based on what we have done and who we have been in the past, dictated only by our history, or will be led to uncover new possibilities for our future that will take great wisdom and courage to name and to claim? If our future is only descriptive of our past, it will fail to envision new beliefs, actions and attitudes that can assist us in forming a visionary future. The Third Law of Performance from the book underscores that "leaders listen for the future of the organization." Are you listening for our future? It begins now, with each of us attuned to what God is calling us toward.
