Parable from the Pastor

March 2020 seems like an eternity ago. No one could have predicted the life-altering consequences that have impacted our lives these last seven months nor estimated our potential for growth, even amid incredible challenges. What have we learned during these unexpected and unwelcome circumstances is what we already knew, "nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord." In spite of the difficulties, the obstacles, the pain and the panic, we have survived. We have learned that "with God, all things are possible."

What we learned during these months is that even without worship in our beautiful sanctuary, without the opportunity to hear our magnificent organ, our talented choir, without Sunday School and even without coffee hour, we learned that the church is not the building. Weekly worship has continued. We learned music can be enjoyed through the commitment of Christine to play and record her gifts for our internet services. We learned that Sunday worship can be held in our jammies, drinking coffee and around the kitchen table with our closest loved ones. (Don't get used to this!).

These months have taught us that our church family is knit tightly by shared experiences that cannot be broken by forced distancing. We learned strange new skills called YouTube and Zoom to stay connected, to worship, conduct monthly Session meetings and to pray together. We learned to contribute our offerings differently than placing them in an offering plate. Our children and parents learned that Sunday School lessons still arrived in our inbox faithfully and regularly on a weekly basis. We learned that Pastor Mitch can transition from 12-15 minute sermons to 7-8 minute meditations to emulate the Rev. David Stewart method of preaching!

We learned that we can still provide Saturday breakfast and do it safely. We are still learning as we cautiously emerge from our quarantine. In our first Sunday back in our sanctuary for worship, we learned the numbers of those who attended was fairly low, leaving room for more in coming weeks. We learned that we can (and will) provide live and recorded worship services for those who are not yet comfortable returning to church quite yet. This Sunday we will learn that we can celebrate Holy Communion safely for our first time since January! Thanks be to God. We are learning what we already knew, "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it."

September 30th is Orange Shirt Day

Orange Shirt Day is commemorated across the country on September 30th as this is the time of year that children would be taken from their homes and placed into residential schools. September 30th is a day to remember the many First Nations, Metis and Inuit children who were taken from their families, forced from their culture, and sometimes abused even to the point of <u>death</u> in residential schools in Canada. The orange shirt refers to a shirt that was taken from a six year old residential school student named Phyllis. The shirt had been given to her by her grandmother and was a comforting reminder of home. Phyllis talks of that day saying she remembers "how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared and I felt like I was worth nothing.

All of us little children were crying and no one cared."
