Goodbye 2020! Thank you for what you taught us. Thank you for the reminder, over and over that we are not as in control of our lives or our world as we previously imagined. Thank you for reminding us, over and over that, indeed as The Message translation of Romans 8 assures us... Do you think anyone is going to be able to drive a wedge between us and Christ's love for us? There is no way! Not trouble, not hard times, not hatred, not hunger, not homelessness, not bullying threats, not backstabbing. None of this fazes us because Jesus loves us. I'm absolutely convinced that nothing—nothing living or dead, angelic or demonic, today or tomorrow, high or low, thinkable or unthinkable—absolutely nothing can get between us and God's love because of the way that Jesus our Master has embraced us.

Welcome 2021. We recognize that at least for awhile, you may still resemble 2020. Lest we be fooled, however, we know that the page has turned, and you have and will provide us new opportunities. One opportunity that we may have experienced regularly over the last several months during our many days in quarantine are the all too frequent stops in front of the bathroom mirror! Do you mean that I already need another haircut! I certainly see where the snacks have landed!

Mirrors are good because they tell us the truth. They provide us an opportunity to make the necessary changes and corrections that we need to make. They remind us that it may not be as bad as we perhaps thought. The new year gives us an opportunity, as a church, to look into the mirror. Who are we, historically? What do we believe and know about ourselves that is life-giving and hope-filled? Where in us do we find God's vision and beauty?
