### Pastor's Parable

During Holy Week, we will offer virtual worship services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Maundy Thursday will be a joint service with Trinity and Knox Presbyterian Churches and posted on our website by Thursday, April 1. Good Friday service will be available to view on Friday, April 2.

In our Lenten Bible Study, we have an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of the path Jesus traveled before he made his final trip to Jerusalem. We will gather by Zoom for prayer, conversation and study on the next three Wednesdays (March 10, 17, 24) from 6:00-7:15 PM.



For our first meeting, we will examine the scriptures in which Jesus predicted his death and resurrection. The second meeting we will examine the events of Lazarus death and resurrection that foreshadows his own resurrection and lead to the plot to kill Jesus. On our last meeting, we gather back in Bethany where Jesus is anointed in preparation for his death.

Before we meet on Wednesday, I invite you to read Matthew 16:21-23, Matthew 17:22-23, and Matthew 20, 17-19. As you read consider these questions:

- -What do you think Jesus was feeling as he shared this somber news?
- -What impact did Jesus' revelation about his death have on his disciples?
- -Why do you think Jesus was compelled to tell of his death at this point in his ministry?
