





Pastor's Parable

Final Things:

We are approaching the Final Week of Jesus' ministry on earth. Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Maundy Thursday allows us to remember the Last Meal and the washing of the disciple's feet. Good Friday is that dark day of crucifixion and death.

For many years I have emphasized during Lent: we cannot understand or celebrate Easter unless and until we first trudge the dark path of Holy Week with Jesus. Only then will we come to believe that Jesus has been where we are, felt what we feel and has endured pain and humiliation so common to our lives today. One final Lenten Bible study will be provided on Wednesday, March 24 from 6:00-7:15 PM. We have examined the events of Jesus' life just prior to his triumphant entry into Jerusalem. This week our study will take us through surprising territory:

Read: Matthew 26:6-13, Mark 14:3-9, Luke 7:36-50, and John 12:1-8.

*Who do you suppose is the woman that anointed Jesus' feet? Mary, sister of Lazarus, Mary Magdalene, an unnamed sinful woman? What does this matter? *What extravagant act is described in these passages and why should it be considered extravagant?

*What extravagant acts have you experienced in your life and what made them extravagant?


*Who are the other "bit" players in the story of Jesus in which we may not know their names, yet they are formative in our faith story?
