Parable of the Pastor

A well-known pastor/author said it best, "A life of faith and a life of certainty are not the same." The only certainty within living a life of faith, according to Jesus, is the certainty that God has promised to partner with us through thick and thin, through good times and bad, through ups and downs and everything in-between.

Many people who claim to be persons of faith, however, believe and act as if certainty and faith are synonymous. You hear people claim, "God would never allow me to suffer in this way!" "God doesn't want me to go without." When we find ourselves asking, "Why God? Why did this happen to me, to my loved ones, to my business or family or church?" Suddenly we see through the murkiness and realize that the person who verbalizes these concerns is finding themselves in a crisis of faith vs. certainty. When we think that life provides certainty that is guaranteed, you can be assured that we ventured far from the faith that God offers free of charge.

Notice the language of faith and see how it compares to certainty.

2 Corinthians 5:7 For we walk by faith, not by sight.

Proverbs 3:5-6 Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

Romans 5:1-5 Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. More than that, we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

The faith is God's gift to us in the midst of the storm. The only certainty is not in what will happen or that something will happen a certain way; the certainty is that God will stay close beside and within us in whatever happens. Be confident in our assurance as Paul writes in Romans 8:38-39, "Who will separate us from the love of Christ? 38 For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, 39 nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
