Pastor Mitch Asks "Did You Know?"

Each week the staff provides several ways to inform, inspire, guide, and assist in your weekly worship. Perhaps you are familiar with each of these weekly opportunities but if you have not realized the distinct differences within each, it might lead to new discoveries!

This Week at St. Andrews (TWASA) is a wealth of information about upcoming events within St. Andrew's, the community, the Presbyterian Church in Canada, etc. Also included in TWASA is the registration link and the scripture readings for Sunday worship. The Parable of the Pastor, provided by Pastor Mitch is designed to make you think or laugh, but primarily grow in your faith journey. TWASA is emailed to a significant list of St. Andrew's friends and family each Tuesday and posted on the St. Andrew's website. https://standrewsvictoria.ca

Each Friday the companion video to the upcoming Sunday worship is emailed to the same list as TWASA, is posted to our website on Friday and to our St. Andrew's Facebook page as well. The companion video is a brief prequal to worship and contains a hymn sung or played by Christine and a scripture reading recorded by a St. Andrew's volunteer. Hearing the scripture prior to Sunday helps prepare you for worship on Sunday. Finally, Pastor Mitch provides a prayer and a set of Questions to Ponder which emerge from the scripture and from the sermon. The companion video to the Sunday Worship is no more than 8-10 minutes in length and greatly assists in preparing you to attend in-person worship in our sanctuary or worship with us via our livestream each Sunday at 10:30 AM. (Prelude begins at 10:25 AM.)

Our in-person worship resumed services on Sunday, July 11 after an 8-month hiatus due to COVID restrictions. Even though we still cannot sing as a congregation due to COVID precautions, worship is enriched through the musical gifts of our Director of Music, Christine Purvis who brings our Casavant organ to life. Worship is also led by a worship leader who each Sunday offers scripture and prayers meant to focus and enrich. Rev. Mitch's messages are biblically based, positive and encouraging. Worship services are live streamed as the service happens and recorded for later viewing on the St. Andrew's website. Perhaps you heard a music meditation, or a message live that you would like to hear again. The recording allows you to do just that. Our livestreaming has made possible providing worship to persons who cannot worship with us due to health considerations, distance, travel, or work. St. Andrew's is now ministering to a segment of the St. Andrew's family and friends that we have previously not been able to reach. Whether you worship in sanctuary or via livestream, your presence and participation is valuable to the ministry of our congregation.

Presbyterian Residential Schools on Vancouver Island

The national <u>Truth and Reconciliation Commission</u> brought to light the experiences and impacts of residential schools on indigenous people. September 30th was typically the start of a new residential school year and since 2013 has been a day for marking the need for continued truth and reconciliation. <u>Orange shirts</u> are often worn symbolically as a reminder of one taken from a <u>young girl</u> at the start of her school year – it, like her previous life, was never returned. First Nations speakers and writers commonly say that the first step in reconciliation is becoming educated about our shared history. Consider taking some time to learn more about Presbyterian residential schools in <u>Canada</u>, and on <u>Vancouver Island</u> in <u>Ahousaht</u> and <u>Port Alberni</u>. The archives of the <u>National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation</u>, and the <u>Presbyterian</u> and <u>United</u> Churches, are also good resources.
