





Parable of the Pastor

Are you ready yet? Christmas week is here. Christmas is a mere 4 days away and chances are that you, like me, still have decorating, gift-buying, card-sending, baking and planning left to do. But, the previous question, "Are you ready yet?" connotes more of a spiritual question than one of holiday preparation.

"Are you ready yet?" must have been prominent in the hearts and minds of the young couple preparing to travel much too near the young woman's due date. What if she went into labour while they were on their way? What if she delivered while they were filling out tax forms during their trip? They still were without reservations and a guaranteed place to lodge during their travel. The young woman would have answered our question "Are you ready yet" with a resounding "No, not in the least."

Walter Brueggemann reminds us of these words,

"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. —Philippians 1:3-6

Brueggemann explains, (The Apostle Paul) affirms that our lives are bracketed by the big drama of God's purposes, and we do well to ponder such deep beginnings ... Imagine God's large purposes hovering around your life. Advent is about ceding ourselves over to God in gladness, to refer our life back to God, who has given it to us.

"Are you ready yet?" in reality means, "Are you ready with overflowing love? Are you ready with new insight? No, not ready yet ... but under way with the realization that "the one who began a good work among us will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ."

Suddenly, "Are you ready yet" as it relates to preparing for the holiday pales in comparison with the deeper question of "Are you ready yet?" as it relates to welcoming the birth of God's purpose(s) for each of our lives. Our waiting for Christmas gives us an opportunity to create time and energy and space for those purposes. Aren't you glad that we have more time to prepare for the truly important and deeply significant work of Advent?

Brueggemann prayed, "Coming God, make us ready with overflowing love. May we be on the way to you even as you are on the way to us. May we be glad and grateful as we wait. Amen."
