Tomorrow, Wednesday, March 2, we begin the 40-day season of Lent as we celebrate Ash Wednesday. Many people associate lent with "giving up" something such as meat, soft drinks, or chocolate. Most importantly Lent is a season of examination during which we turn the mirror of our lives inward and see ourselves as God sees us. Do we dare? Certainly, when we are honest, we will uncover components of our lives that we want to change. Absolutely, we will encounter a depth of God's love that we often overlook. ### **Update on Safety Protocols**

Pandemic conditions are thankfully improving! We are continuing to ease our protocols for safe worship, mindful of the needs of both in-person and at-home worshipers who are considering returning. After eight months of depending on clearly defined safety protocols, we are now moving towards a dependence on mutual trust. Starting Sunday March 6th, the major change is that worshipers will now be responsible for keeping others safe by keeping a "respectful distance" from them. (Please be mindful that fellow worshipers may have a greater need for distance than you, no matter how excited you are to see them!) The practical changes include the opening of the gallery, removal of the yellow tape on pews, and people leaving their pew and exiting at the end of the service when they are personally ready to do so. Red tape will remain on pews on the ground floor for the moment, and be added to the front pews in the gallery to keep people back from the railings when they stand to sing. As we have generous seating, we will no longer be using registration.

Two key safety protocols remain: we will continue to require that people be fully vaccinated and wear masks (although we will now welcome people if they have proof of a medical exemption from mask wearing.)

If you have questions or comments, please speak to an elder - we want to ensure that everyone feels safe and feels welcome!
