We celebrated in worship yesterday. We smiled when Sophia and Rob were baptized. When the question was asked, "Do you, as members of this congregation, promise to uphold and support Rob and Serena and promise to guide and nurture Sophia with love and prayer?" As a congregation we answered with enthusiasm, "We will, with God's help!"

We participated as members and friends of this congregation and the day was an opportunity to remember the significance of our own baptism. In baptism, God claims us and names us to show that we belong to God. We are tempted to forget that God has claimed all people as beloved children. It is the sacrament not of what we do but of what God has done for us in Christ.

God's grace and our response to it are not tied to the moment of Baptism, but continue and deepen throughout life... Baptism assures us that we belong to God in life and in death.

Our greatest comfort is that we belong to our faithful Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will share our story and our Christian stories in what we do and say.


We will look for and name the holy in everyone we meet.
