

PARABLE OF THE PASTOR

Collaborative Ministry? What does this mean when we consider the possibilities for our Presbyterian churches in Victoria?

The ministers of Knox, Trinity and St. Andrew's have been meeting, talking, and dreaming for several months to formulate an answer to the above question. What does collaborative ministry mean? So far, we know what it does not mean. Some want to begin the conversation with the only solution, in their mind at least, that each of the other two congregations should sell their buildings and join with St. Andrews at St. Andrews. Foregone conclusions always shut down conversations rather than lead to an honest exploration.

An exploration of collaborative ministry does not begin with a foregone conclusion before we engage in a conversation in which the of sharing ideas, dreams and possibilities is paramount. This is a conversation in which we do more listening than we speak. This is a conversation centered in prayer for the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The ministers know this is a conversation that must be joined by elders from each of our congregations who are committed to listening first to understand and prayerfully searching for examples of what collaborative ministry could potentially mean for Knox, Trinity, St. Andrews, and the Chinese Presbyterian.

We begin with a pulpit swap on Sunday, September 11 in which the ministers from our three congregations will each fill the pulpit in a congregation different than his/her own. Following worship that day, a picnic at the Esquimalt-Gorge Park will be an opportunity for our congregations to gather socially, to bring a picnic lunch for your family and one item to share. What a perfect opportunity to meet new friends and renew old friendships.

On September 15 our collaborative conversation with elders and ministers from each congregation will occur as we gather to listen to one another, to pray and to begin to look ahead. We are at a formative stage in our transitional work as we begin to explore the possibilities of what it means to be a Presbyterian, and to be Christ-centered in a city that needs our work and our witness more than ever.
