Parable of the Pastor

Sunday is World Communion Sunday. Churches worldwide will be celebrating Holy Communion on this day to emphasize our relationship as the Body of Christ. As we partake of the elements to emphasize that we are indeed One Body, One Faith, One Lord, we are reminded that there is more that unifies us than divides us!

I hope you will be present Sunday to celebrate communion in person that we will not partake of again until December. Whether you worship in-person in sanctuary or worship via our livestream worship, please prepare to partake of communion wherever you are. If you are at home, prior to turning on the livestream, take time to have bread or a cracker, juice or even water. As the elements are blessed, shared and consumed, please participate wherever you are.

Participate fully in worship. Sunday, I noticed during the reading of the Call to Worship, Prayer of Confession, the Lord's Prayer, and the response following the scripture how few were really participating in worship. Many were listening but not responding. Worship is not a spectator activity in which you come to watch, listen, and go home. Worship is participating actively in the prayers, readings, and scripture. When you read the Call to Worship and the Prayer of Confession, you are not reading to me or to your closest neighbour, you are replying and responding to God. When scripture is read, and the affirmation given after the reading, "The Word of the Lord" is our our praise to God for these holy words and our response is spoken to God, "Thanks be to God." Please worship as a participant and not as a spectator, wherever you worship!!

As noted in the worship this past Sunday, we have resumed the presentation of our offering during worship. The elders will be bringing the offering plates forward during worship again to emphasize that our giving and receiving of our tithes are, indeed, a public act of worship. Please do not neglect to participate in the opportunity of giving to God a portion of what God has given to you.

Finally, on October 9, Session has declared that mask wearing will now be optional during worship but not required. For those who will remain cautious and continue to wear masks personally, the south side of the sanctuary will continue to be roped with spaces between every other pew. As we have practiced since the beginning of the pandemic, our first commitment is keeping our membership safe. We will monitor the current COVID trends and hope that the loosening of regulations will be sustained if numbers remain low.

Prelude for this Sunday is
"Schmucke dich, o liebe Seele"
Deck thyself, my soul, with
gladness by Gustav Merkel. It is
based on the hymn which was
written in the 17th century by
Johann Franck and Johann Cruger
as a communion hymn. Gustav
Merkel was a German Romantic
composer who wrote mainly for
the organ.

The postlude is a Prelude & Fugue in G major by Johann Kuhnau who lived from 1660-1722 and was active as a novelist, translator, lawyer and music theorist. He was able to combine all those activities and hold the position of Thomaskantor in Leipzig ro 21 years. He is known today primarily for his musical compositions.
